HOW OUR TEAM CAN HELP YOUR COMPANY

Downhill mountain bike racing is the fastest growing segment of bicycle racing. Cycling has proven to be a popular, cost-effective form of promotion and advertising. Turn on the television and you can see cyclists being used to sell all types of products ranging from cars to food. Bicycle riding is one of the top three forms of recreation in the United States with over 59 million Americans riding a bike each year (from the 1996 Interbike directory). Many non-cycling companies are turning to sponsorship of racing teams. This includes companies such as: Saturn, Volkswagen, Volvo, Ralph Lauren, Tommy Hilfiger, Polo Sport, Mountain Dew, Mrs. T's Pierogies, Conde Nast Sports Magazine, Navigator's Insurance. Even the US Postal Service sponsors a racing team!

Attendance at local races can range from 100 - 500 participants; while National Championship Series races draw 10,000 - 15,000 spectators and nearly 2,000 racers. In addition, these races are televised on ESPN, ESPN2 and Outdoor Life Network, giving additional exposure for your company. Participants in mountain bike races range in age from 10 - 70, with the majority in the 25-35 age bracket. These racers tend to hold full-time jobs, own their own homes, and have incomes of \$30,000 and up. Demographically, they are part of the largest purchasing segment in the US. Some of the benefits your company can receive by sponsoring our team are:

 \cdot Your company's name and/or logo will appear on our competition clothes, team vehicle and exhibition tent, along with the right to use our team or team member's name and likeness in their advertising campaign.

 \cdot Press releases issued by the team include information about the team sponsors. We regularly issue press releases to the local media and the cycling press.

 \cdot We consider ourselves ambassadors for your company. When you sponsor our team, we do everything we can to promote your company and products, including distributing product information and samples at races.

 \cdot Racers' team names are announced during races and appear on results boards at these races. Team names are always announced at awards presentation, and our racers appear at these presentations in their team jersey or other team clothing with sponsors names/logos on it.

 \cdot "The Chevy Trucks National Championship Series reached more than 3.8 million homes via 24 airings on ESPN and espn2. For the 7-race series, 13,084 riders raced the trails while 87,500 spectators looked on." – USA Cycling Ad in VeloNews 11/16/98. Each race is shown several times on both networks. Additionally, Outdoor Life Network has extensive coverage of mountain bike racing and even has a weekly show dedicated to bicycle racing.

 \cdot Our racers train 365 days a year. This means your company name on our team jerseys is visible to the public every day while our racers train on the road, in local parks and local ski areas.


